Participation in the Japan Public-Private Platform for REDD+

The first platform to reduce CO₂ emissions through forests in developing nations, working together with the public and private sectors

On November 7, Sumitomo Forestry Co., Ltd. entered into a partnership agreement with the Japan Public-Private Platform for REDD+, established by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and Forestry and Forest Products Research Institute, an independent administrative corporation. The move is hoped to contribute to conservation of forests in developing nations, mitigating climate change, preserving biodiversity, and encouraging sustainable development such as poverty reduction.

Redd⁺¹ is an initiative to control, absorb and retain CO₂ emissions through the preservation of forests in developing nations in an effort to mitigate climate change. The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) is working to build consensus regarding establishment of the system.

This platform aims to promote REDD+ activities, engaging the cooperation of private companies and organizations along with government agencies that support the intent of an urgent action plan. It will (1) share ideas concerning REDD+, (2) convey information to the public about REDD+ activities, and (3) discuss the promotion of REDD+ related business. Sumitomo Forestry is one of around 40 private companies, organizations, and government agencies that have announced their participation. Moving forward we hope to expand that circle to contribute to global warming countermeasures through public-private collaboration.

Previously, Sumitomo Forestry was selected in fiscal 2011 to conduct a feasibility study for the Joint Crediting Mechanism (JCM), a program implemented by the Global Environment Centre Foundation (GEC), the operator commissioned by the Ministry of the Environment. From this beginning, we have undertaking various activities in collaboration with government departments including the Ministry of the Environment, the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry, and the Forestry Agency along with JICA, Forestry and Forest Products Research Institute and other government agencies. Recently, we participated in and assisted the Workshops on the Provincial REDD+ Action Plan (PRAP), held in July 2014, in Vietnam's Dien Bien Province. The move aims to mitigate global warming through maintenance and preservation of forests in Vietnam, Indonesia and Southeast Asia as a whole and cooperate to reduce emissions of greenhouse gases.

The Sumitomo Forestry Group will actively promote environmental initiatives such as this platform that leverage the Group's strengths.

REDD+ is an acronym for Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation in Developing Countries, which aims to control CO₂ emissions globally through its actions. The "plus" was added to reflect the conservation of forest carbon stocks, sustainable management of forests, and enhancement of forest carbon stocks in developing countries. Presently, as one countermeasure against climate change, funds are being distributed globally to support emission reduction through forest preservation in developing countries





for REDD+ promotion by the United Nations and others. Discussions have been held to use the funds as an incentive to promote forest preservation and additionally, investigation is underway for it to be adopted as a project for credit issuance under the JCM system currently being prepared by the Japanese government.
