Sumitomo Forestry Co., Ltd. hereby announces that, in addition to being selected for excellence in sustainability performance, it has, for the third year in a row, earned the highest possible “Gold Class” rating from RobecoSAM (Head Office: Switzerland), a world leading assessor of socially responsible investments (SRI). Furthermore, Sumitomo Forestry has also been selected as the “Industry Leader” (top scoring company) in the Homebuilding Industry for the third consecutive year. This year, it has also been selected as the Industry Mover (company with the biggest score improvement compared to the previous year).

Every year, RobecoSAM assesses the economic, environmental and social activities of about 3,000 leading companies in the world. It selects the top 15% of companies in 59 industries for their excellence in sustainability, and publishes them in *The Sustainability Yearbook*. Those companies whose performance is particularly excellent receive Gold Class, Silver Class and Bronze Class distinctions.

Of the 39 Japanese companies that were selected for their excellence in sustainability performance, five companies received the Gold Class distinction, and four companies were selected as Industry Leaders (company with the highest assessment).
