Support for Construction of Temple Schools in Myanmar Opening Ceremony for Temple School No. 1, Completed by the Myanmar Temple School Support Team

Sumitomo Forestry Co., Ltd. has since December 2013 been involved in the Myanmar Temple School Support Team, a body which it established to support the construction of Temple School-style community schools in Myanmar. The first school building has now been completed, for which an opening ceremony was held on March 19. Ryu Yano, Chairman of Sumitomo Forestry attended along with 20 representatives of the 12 Japanese companies who supported the project, and all received a warm welcome from the students of the school.

The Temple School was completed by the end of October 2014 through the generosity of 18 companies and 4 individuals. The three story building, constructed in the Mingaladon district in northern Myanmar, is presently attended by around 260 eager students, ranging in age from 5 to 16 years old. The building can also act as a refuge for members of the local community during heavy rain. Moving forward, the Myanmar Temple School Support Team aims to assist in the construction of one school per year.

Public schools are tuition-free in Myanmar; however, students are required to pay facility fees and donations, so many children are unable to attend school for economic reasons. Temple School, which is affiliated with temples and operated by priests, play an important role in the education of these children. At the opening ceremony, Ryu Yano gave a congratulatory speech, telling the students that "This Temple School will provide you with the opportunity to learn. I hope that you will follow your

dreams, thinking and striving to enjoy a life without regrets. If you have ambition, doors will open for you."

In December 2014, Sumitomo Forestry established a joint venture in Myanmar, (MOS Lumber Products Co., Ltd.) for the manufacture and sale of building materials made mainly using timber from rubber trees. The company aims to grow along with the region and contribute to Myanmar's ongoing economic development both through support for the Temple Schools and through business.
