Two Employees Win Silver Medals in the Carpentry Category at the 53rd National Skills Competition!

Sumitomo Forestry Home Engineering Co., Ltd. (President: Susumu Higuchi; Head Office: Shinjuku-ku, Tokyo), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Sumitomo Forestry Co., Ltd. (President and Representative Director: Akira Ichikawa; Head Office: Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo), announced that two employees participated in the 53rd National Skills Competition held at Makuhari Messe in Chiba Prefecture and won silver medals in the carpentry category. This is the 15th consecutive year the company garnered awards, and the 8th time that all employees who participated received awards.

At the National Skills Competition, young craftsmen test their skills to become the best in Japan.

The competition also aims to give the next generation of young craftsmen concrete goals to strive towards, to widely promote the importance and necessity of craftsmanship by providing young people with a chance to see some of the most advanced craftsmanship in Japan, and to foster a respect for craftsmanship. This year the competition was held over a four day period from December 4-7 at Makuhari Messe in Chiba Prefecture. Around 1,200 participants under the age of 23 represented their respective prefectures in 41 categories. Employees from Sumitomo Forestry Home Engineering took part in the carpentry category, which attracted a record-high of 78 participants

The contestants from Sumitomo Forestry Home Engineering were selected from among employees who had completed necessary carpenter training at the Sumitomo Forestry School of Professional Building Techniques (Institute Director: Toshiaki Watanabe; Location: Yotsukaido, Chiba Prefecture). Sumitomo Forestry School of Professional Building Techniques is an internal vocational training institute founded in 1988 with the purpose of fostering craftsmen to build high-quality Sumitomo Forestry Home houses. "Fostering craftsmen with a balance of heart, skills, and body" is the training philosophy on which the school provides a distinctive one-year curriculum necessary for a construction craftsman, balancing fundamental knowledge and practical skills. The school's mission is to foster the next generation of Japanese wood house craftsmen with the ability to build not only wooden houses using Sumitomo Forestry's proprietary methods, but to build structures using traditional Japanese wooden post-and-beam construction methods. After completion of their courses, the students begin working as carpenters employed by Sumitomo Forestry Home Engineering, building technologically sophisticated "Sumitomo Forestry Home" houses and providing safe and reliable homes for their residents.
